**AGENDA**

**Old Business:**

1. Public Hearing regarding the communication of July 13, 2015 from John McConnell, requesting eight handicapped signs at the Chelsea's Soldiers Home, the Crest and Hillside Avenue entrance.
2. Communication of October 19, 2015 from the Library Director Sarah Gay, requesting the Commission consider adding additional handicapped parking spaces on Marlboro Street at the ADA accessible ramp, add one or more short term (15 minute) parking spaces marked as "Library Business Only" on Marlboro and Library Street, and dedicated long term, non-metered Library Business only spaces.
3. Communication of October 27, 2015 from the City Manager Tom Ambrosino, requesting the Commission conduct a study of the new traffic pattern at the intersection of Washington Avenue and Revere Beach Parkway.
4. Handicapped sign application of November 19, 2015 for Josefina Ruiz, 265 Maple Street.
5. Communication of January 27, 2016 from Jamal Abdulkadir, requesting a Stop sign on Cary Avenue at Clark Avenue due to public safety concerns.
6. Public Hearing regarding the communication of February 17, 2016 from Alex Train of Planning and Development, requesting to convert the three metered parking spaces, immediately following the curb cut at 157 Hawthorne Street, to a commercial loading zone to reduce double parking and improve traffic circulation in the downtown area.

**New Business:**

7. Minutes of the February 23, 2016 meeting.
8. Communication of February 23, 2016 from Councilor Roy Avellaneda, requesting the Commission come up with a plan to address the amount of cut-thru traffic the city receives from East Boston and Logan Airport.
9. Communication of February 24, 2016 from Councilor Giovanni Recupero and Councilor Judith Garcia, requesting (1) that the Traffic and Parking Commission extend the Restrictive Residential Parking Permit to residents of Congress Avenue, from Park Street to Broadway, as well as Third Street; (2) look into putting a mirror on the light post on the corner of Summit and Warren Avenue facing Lafayette Street to make it easier and safer for the drivers on Lafayette Street to see the people who are coming from Franklin and Warren Avenue, along with a flashing border on the stop sign on Lafayette Street; and (3) to inquire to the appropriate

department about putting signs stating that drivers need to give way to pedestrians on the crosswalks in the Square, both by McDonalds and the crosswalk by TD Bank, as well as at the three way intersection of Washington Avenue, Cary Avenue, and Forsyth Street, and on the intersection of Washington Avenue and Carter Street.

10. Communication of March 3, 2016 from Stanley Troisi, requesting that a "No Parking Here to Corner" sign placed in front of 162 Washington Avenue and a "No Parking Anytime" sign put up between sign #1 and the bus stop as a follow-up to a request placed two years ago before the Commission.
11. Communication of March 10, 2016 from Councilor Paul Murphy, requesting a public hearing into the possibility of making Hancock Street a one-way from Everett border to Franklin Street.
12. Communication of March 23, 2016 from Andraya Lombardi, regarding parking issues at the construction site and its surrounding streets of the Clark Avenue Middle School.



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
